Our National Children & Youth Chair, Pam Ray, has challenged every state to give out at least one Youth Hero/Good Deed Award this year. I'm asking California to meet this challenge, so let's get busy and find those youngsters who deserve to be acknowledged for their good deeds and/or heroism, then submit their name(s) to National for recognition, and plan a special activity or event to celebrate them!
